Our mission is to address the critical shortage of surgical facilities and trained surgeons in Haiti through the volunteer efforts of surgeons & others, and by raising financial resources to develop a long-term solution. Despite all the turmoil and violence, our Haitian staff continues to be the only provider of 24/7 medical and surgical care in this rural area.

In 2021, the Shawn Warren Crowley Medical Building opened with a lab and space for medical, pediatric, HIV, and dental clinics. In 2022, expansion of the surgicenter and ER was completed. Over the next few months, solar panels will be installed on its roof. A new Maternity Center is in progress, which will house a delivery suite and OR for obstetrical care, a large recovery room for post-op patients, office space, and a community room for staff & teaching.



Additional experience includes over 10 years of academic teaching, and a history of being able to coordinate medical services between governmental and private organizations. 
Sam Fabiano, MD


Anthony Kovac, MD

More recently, Judy aids Bhutanese refugees resettled in the Kansas City area, teaching English as Second Language (ESL) in association with Mission Adelante, and continues to lead healthcare teams to Nepal, where her cultural expertise facilities their effective service.



Nizar Mamdani

Nizar Mamdani grew up in Tanzania, East Africa and received his undergraduate and graduate education in Tokyo, Japan. He has served as the Executive Director of International Healthcare at the University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC). After almost 20 years of service at UNMC, Nizar recently retired. He speaks seven languages and has travelled extensively in Asia, Africa, Central and South America and the Middle East. Nizar and his wife, Marsha Davidson-Mamdani, PhD, are also the founders and the CEO of First Sight, a philanthropic organization established to provide free, low-tech, fool-proof, clinically tested and affordable vision-screening and prescription eyeglasses to children and adults in developing countries. 
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
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
