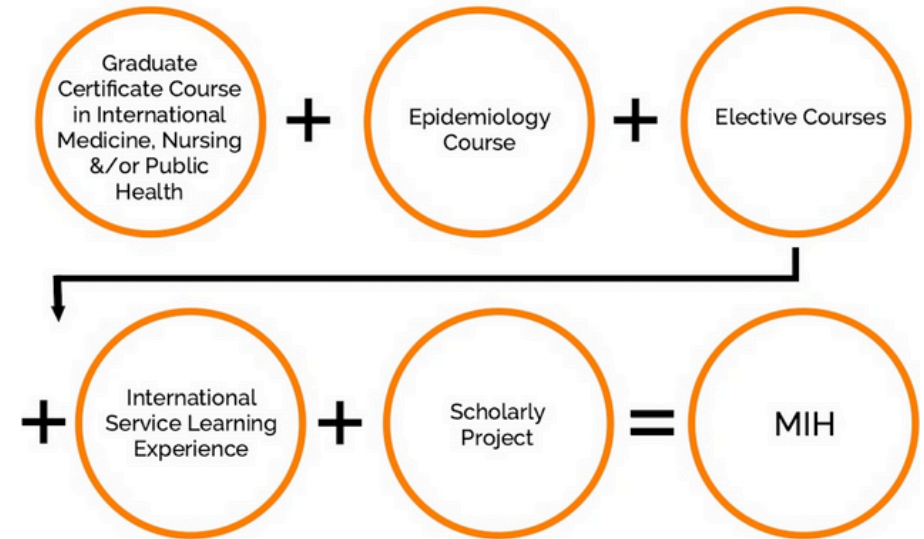
Three specialty tracks are available: International Medicine, International Nursing, and International Public Health.
