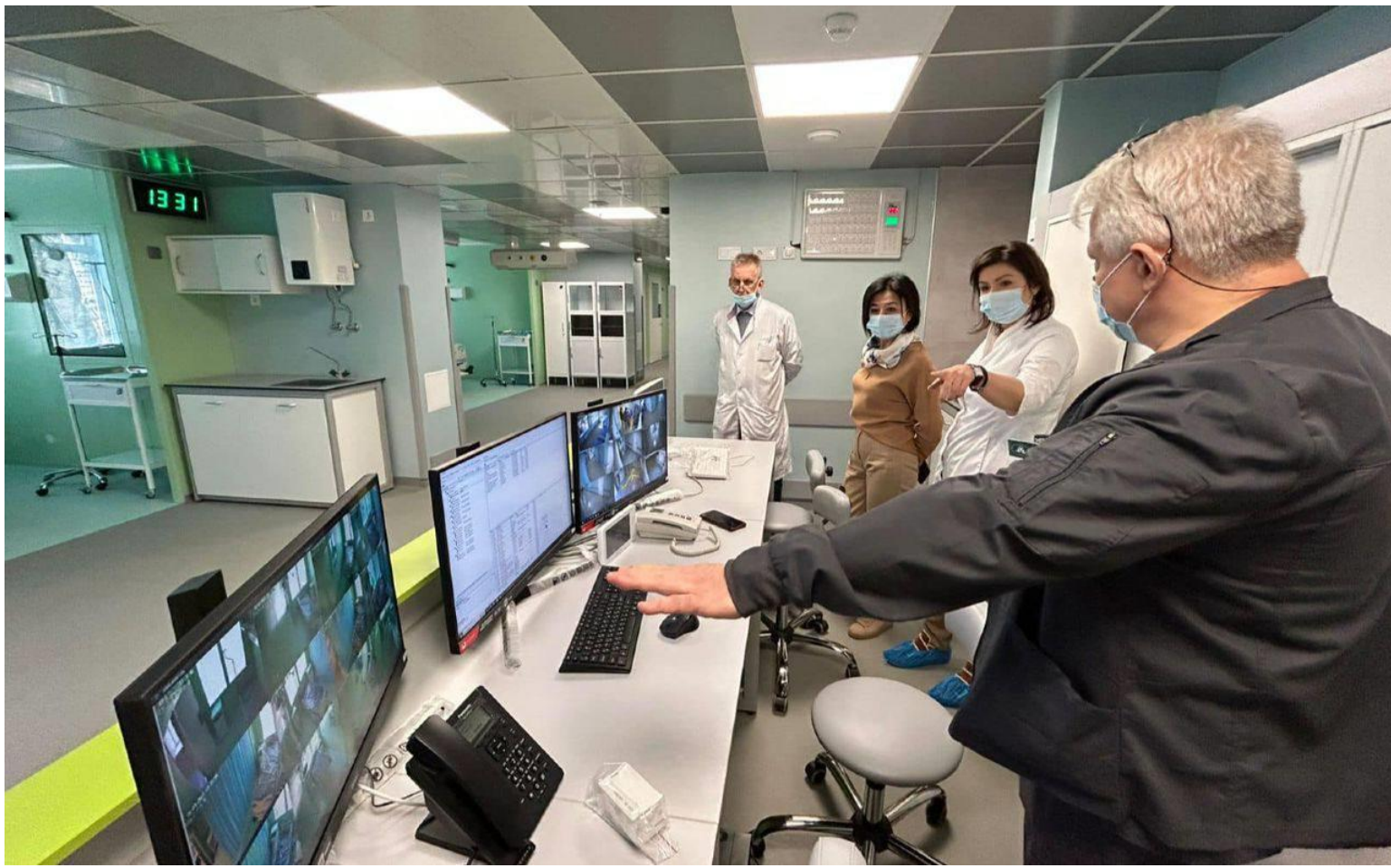

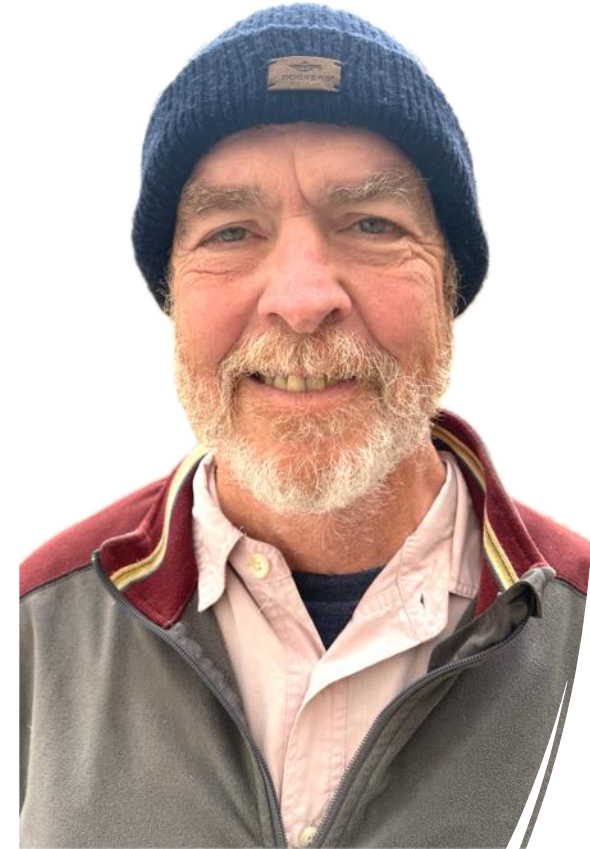
Practice Recommendations
